

About (SLD) Social Learning Disability you must go back at least 10,000 years when agricultural ruler ship would no longer play a leading role in the sector of the economy. This served as initiation of enlightenment of civilization. The first sign of discovery is civilization. This initiation was for the younger Mediterranean peoples Greeks, romans, among others. The land where the Mediterranean people went of pilgrimages was to Kemet. With economic resources assured by means that did not require perpetual inventions, the indigenous people of the land became indifferent to material progress because material progress it did not defined the indigenous people of the land it was how they treated the land and how they related to it and the same applied to how they related and treated each other; cultivating their growth in a civil and humane way.

What type of social relationships existed and encounter between then still plays out in the present, between the people of the Mediterranean and the indigenous people of the land Kemet, Europe and Africa, Blacks and whites. Do to this social interaction consequently some of the blacks that lived in the Sahara 700bc presumably left to migrate toward upper Nile (Ghion), with the possible exception of a few isolated groups on the rest of the continent either had migrated toward the south, possibly the first group found indigenous Black population in region of the upper Nile. It was the gradual adaption to develop new living conditions which nature assigned to these various groups.

The adaption to the narrow, fertile Nile Valley required expert technique to foresee the inundations of the Nile and to reduce their economic and social consequences. How many people have to make adjustments for you and me every day so we don't cause ourselves or others harm?

What I would like to offer is a gap insurance plan that will help us all to merge the gap between who we are and who we think we are so that we can live out the true purpose of our lives.

A child has yet to form any concrete opinions of themselves nor about the world around them and neither should we. I started out the ideal FATHER then became reckless and careless with my relationship of trust with her mother and wound up taking a beating in the courts and had some challenges with finances and did dabble in drugs for a brief part of my life, but while I was down I was never out. God had intended, I think, for me to learn what I needed to know. Continued on page 10

What would you say to Fathers who are not seeing their children right now?

I almost lost my life to Gillian Barre' Syndrome and almost died at Providence Hospital. My irresponsibility had brought me all the way down to the point where while I was in a coma for three days caught up before life and death, I had a talk with God in my heart and he spared my life. The Spirit shone forth in my dream as a Great White Light and when I woke back up and saw my family, who had come to bury me, I changed my ways. I became responsible, respectable as I was elevated and celebrated, involved and committed as possible in the life of my child. Today God is blessing us in many ways and he has taught us a valuable lesson in power of forgiveness. This is what those fathers need who are not seeing their children. They need to forgive and be forgiven in their heart of hearts then start on a path and journey that takes them to the hearts of their children.

What lies behind us, and what lies before us is never more powerful than what lies within us! For the believer, make on covenant with evil, show no mercy to evil and hate; take the victory found in Jesus name! Remember His forgiveness is beyond all comprehension. Find the forgiveness in your spirit and seek to give your children the love they need from a father that is irreplaceable.

Everything we do and say in the presence of our children makes an impression on them. We may think we can get away with swearing or gossiping in front of them when they can't talk, but we have forgotten that just because they can't talk doesn't mean they don't hear. We may feel that we have put ourselves under a microscope, which can be stressful. However, it can also lead to a great healing of our own unresolved issues and, in turn, it enables us to



be good parents to our children. Talking to other conscious parents about this life transformation can be very helpful.

Our desire to become the best we can be is often strongest at the very beginning of a child's life and sometimes loses its intensity as we grow accustomed to their presence. However, it is never too late to look at ourselves and notice whether we are offering our best to our children. That original welling up of love and hope can inspire us throughout our lives to be the best we can be.
